

Why is the Blue Don Fund Necessary?


Every student who attends Madonna High School receives the benefit of a tuition grant. Since the actual cost to educate a student is \$9,153 and the Catholic tuition rate is \$5,950, Madonna is always looking for ways to fill the gap between the two. Examples include families who receive additional discounts for multiple students or tuition assistance packages from generous donors.

On average, each student is receiving assistance of at least \$3,203. That's why grants, tuition assistance packages, and your donations are crucial to keeping Catholic education affordable for our families.

You may not have realized it while walking the halls of Madonna High School, but there were many helping make the cost of your education less expensive for your family.

There has been a long history of working closely with families, community organizations, partner parishes, and the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to establish funds designed to ease the burdens of our families.

Think about your experience here at Madonna and consider ways that you can help to make that same experience a reality for those currently here and those who are still to come.
