Madonna Class of 2021 Graduates

On Saturday, May 29, 2021, Madonna High School held its commencement ceremony inside Finnegan Fieldhouse located on the campus of Franciscan University of Steubenville. With many COVID precautions still in place, using this location allowed for more guests to attend the ceremony safely.

The class of 2021 were followed by the faculty and staff into the fieldhouse to "Pomp and Circumstance." Class President Sydney Crawford sang the National Anthem, followed by a welcome to all in attendance. Madonna's designated pastor, Very Rev. Dennis Schuelkens Jr., delivered the invocation. Salutatorian, Elyse Chartier and the Valedictorians, Sydney Crawford and Madalena Daugherty eloquently presented their speeches to all in attendance.

Commencement speaker, Dr. Kristen Finley Sobota '00, praised the class of 2021 for their resilience during the Coronavirus pandemic. Class of 2021 Highlights

- Full or partial scholarships were awarded to 85% of the class. \$2,713,158 in scholarship funds over 4 years have been offered with \$1,365,908 being accepted over 4 years. 11 seniors qualified for the WV Promise Scholarship based upon their overall GPA, core GPA, and standardized test scores. These students met the academic requirements to receive \$4,750 annually towards their tuition and fees at public or independent colleges/universities in West Virginia.

Aquinas Award and St. Sebastian Medal Winners



Sydney Crawford, is the 2021 Aquinas Award recipient from Madonna High School. Sydney was selected by the faculty of Madonna High School. The award recognizes students for their outstanding qualities of faithful discipleship, academic excellence, leadership and service to the school, parish and community, reflecting the ideals of Catholic education epitomized by St. Thomas Aquinas, the patron saint of students. It is the highest honor a student can receive from the diocese.

Sydney is the daughter of Michael and Karen Crawford, and sister to Kelsey and Haley Crawford. She is an active member of St. Joseph the Worker Church where she volunteers at children's liturgy. Sydney is the class president, serves as treasurer of the Science Club, representative of the Interact Club and is a member of the Drama, Pro-Life, and SADD Clubs. She is the treasurer and member of the National Honor Society. She represented Madonna at the HOBY Leadership Seminart and the Weirton Youth Leadership Program. Sydney was an altar server and sang in the choir for school masses. She lettered on the Lady Dons Cheer team all four years, is a two year letterman of the soccer team, and a one year letterman of the tennis team. The cheer team qualified for the State Cheer Competition three times while she was a member. She earned a OVAC soccer championship, two cheer OVAC championships, and one cheer regional championship. She was a USA Junior Olympic gymnast for five years and qualified for state and regional competitions. Sydney will attend the University of Notre Dame and major in Neuroscience.

Madalena Daugherty and Lucky Pulice were selected to receive the St. Sebastian Medal from the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston. The St. Sebastian Medal is named for St. Sebastian, the Patron Saint of Athletes, because he was always depicted in fine physical shape. Madalena and Lucky are being recognized for being high-achieving student athletes and exhibiting the qualities of sportsmanship, teamwork, academics, and a high respect for school, classmates, teammates, opponents, parish, and the community.

and basketballs that allowed them to see how being under the influence can affect their vision, coordination, and reflexes.




