Class of 2022 Highlights

Full or partial scholarships were awarded to 82% of the class. \$2,750,254 in scholarship funds over 4 years have been offered with \$1,345,074 being accepted over 4 years. 52% of college bound seniors qualified for the WV Promise Scholarship based upon their overall GPA, core GPA, and standardized test scores. These students met the academic requirements to receive \$5,000 annually towards their tuition and fees at public or independent colleges/universities in West Virginia.

St. Aquinas and St. Sebastian Award Winners



Nate Elias was named the 2022 Aquinas Award recipient from Madonna High School. Nate was selected by the faculty of Madonna. It is the highest honor a student can receive from the diocese.




